- A prior Rabies Certificate is required to receive a 3-year Rabies vaccine; otherwise vaccine will be good for 1 year
- Bring other vaccine records if possible
- If you have a cat, please go to the front of the clinic line
- Flea & Tick Control available while supplies last (price depends on pet's weight)
- Anal gland expression \$10
- Nail trims (if time allows) \$12
- \$3 Haz Mat Disposal Fee charged per pet
- Prices below are CASH prices which reflect a \$3 per pet cash discount
- NO checks accepted for medical services & supplies
- Licensing usually available at our clinics for your convenience (Cash, Credit Cards & Checks accepted for licensing)

WE CANNOT VACCINATE A PET WHICH:

- ✓ Has ever had an adverse reaction to a vaccine
- ✓ Is nursing puppies or kittens
- ✓ Has shown any sign of illness in the past 2 weeks
- ✓ Might be pregnant
- Please notify our staff upon arrival if your pet is on medication; is undergoing any medical treatment; may possibly have any medical/health condition; or may be aggressive towards other pets or people.
- Keep your pet a safe distance from other pets & people.
- Dogs must be on leashes & cats must be in carriers. (No cardboard carriers allowed).

MICROCHIPS for DOGS & CATS \$30

(Includes Microchip Registration & 24/7 Lost & Found Pet Recovery Assistance)

ROUNDWORM / TAPEWORM DE-WORMING \$15 - \$35 per dose (depends on type & pet's weight)

RABIES (Thimerosal Free for DOGS & CATS) **\$7** ← (12 wks & older) → (Purevax Non-Adjuvant - for CATS) 1 yr **\$23** 3 yr **\$49**

The first Rabies vaccine is good for 1 year, regardless of pet's age. Thereafter, Rabies vaccines are good for 3 years as long as at least 12 months have passed since the pet received its first Rabies vaccination and valid proof of a prior Rabies vaccination by a licensed veterinarian in the U.S. is provided.

<u>DHPP</u> (Distemper, Hepatitis, Parvo & Parainfluenza)	(6 wks & older)	\$23
<u>ORAL BORDETELLA</u> (Bronchiseptica)	(8 wks & older)	\$18
<u>LYME</u> (Borrelia Burgdorferi)	(9 wks & older)	\$25
<u>FVRCP</u> (Feline Viral Rhinotracheitis, Calici, Panleukopenia)	(6 wks & older)	\$23
<u>FELV</u> (Feline Leukemia)	(8 wks & older)	\$25



♥ Pets should always receive an initial series of vaccinations (2 to 3 sets depending on age) approximately 4 weeks apart, then boosters in one year. Thereafter, annual vaccinations or vaccinations every three years are recommended, depending on the type of vaccine and the pet's environment. Ideally, pets should receive one of their sets of initial vaccines between 14 to 16 weeks of age to achieve the best immunity against disease. ♥ Pets adopted from shelters should receive at least one vaccination booster between 2 - 5 weeks after being adopted, regardless of its age. ♥
